- Children of Local 12 members who work for companies that are PCA member companies.
- Children of staff members of PCA member companies (administrative assistants, project managers, etc.). Staff members must have worked at their company for at least one year. No temporary employees may apply.
- Family members of company owners who are signatory to Local Union #12.
- Interns who have worked for a firm for a) at least 1 year or b) at least 2 internship sessions.

Participation in the scholarship program is limited to PCA member companies and Signatory Contractors of Plumbers Local 12 only.
