The Greater Boston Plumbing Contractors Association Donates \$10,000 to Boston-Area Organizations for Thanksgiving

The Greater Boston Plumbing Contractors Association announced today that it has donated \$10,000 to both Father Bill's MainSpring in Brockton and Community Servings in Jamaica Plain. The Greater Boston PCA, represents Boston area Plumbing and Gasfitting Contractors which are signatory to the Local Union 12. A force for good in the Plumbing Industry, the Greater Boston PCA also seeks to give back to the communities in which its Contractors work.

The donations will help support the efforts of two local organizations that seek to provide services for our region's most vulnerable populations. Father Bill's MainSpring has been a leading innovator of ending homelessness in Southern Massachusetts for the last three decades. Their mission is to end and prevent homelessness with programs that provide emergency and permanent housing and help people obtain skills, jobs, housing, and services.

Community Servings, located in the Jamaica Plain neighborhood of Boston, was founded in 1990 to provide home-delivered meals to individuals living with HIV/AIDS in Dorchester and Roxbury. Since then, Community Servings has evolved to a regional program serving nutritionally tailored meals and providing nutrition education to thousands of people per year across Massachusetts — all of whom are unable to shop or cook for themselves or their families due to a critical illness.

“Thanksgiving has always been a time of the year to give back to those who need an extra hand.” Commented Greater Boston PCA President Joe Valante. He continued to say, “This year more than ever we have seen food insecurity in our communities grow and we remain committed to helping combat this as an Association.”

The Greater Boston PCA continues its commitment to giving back after already donating to the City of Boston Mayor's Resiliency Fund and the Greater Boston Food Bank at the outset of the COVID-19 pandemic.
